This will be Daiwik's third property after Rameshwaram and Tirupati. Daiwik Hotels Dwarka will be a Greenfield investment of Rs 45 Cr slated to become operational by 2015. Ltd. The first project from the hospitality brand, Daiwik Hotels Rameswaram, in Tamil Nadu is currently operational and their flagship project is coming up in Tirupati, Andhra Pradesh.
